

## E REMINDER



Because Congress stalled on last year's reauthorization of the farm bill, our Offering of Letters is again focused on this vital legislation. The farm bill sponsors the nutrition programs so vital to hungry people. A few examples are SNAP (formerly called Food Stamps); WIC - for pregnant and nursing mothers, babies and toddlers; the School lunch and Breakfast programs; international emergency food assistance and agricultural development programs; and the McGovern-Dole School Feeding Programs. Sadly, hunger still threatens many of God's children. Millions of Americans live in poverty (\$25,820 for a family of three) and millions more are considered low income. It is common for low-wage jobs to be part-time or temporary with irregular hours, no medical insurance, sick leave or vacation time, and no skills training or pathway to promotion. Across the globe, millions are facing actual starvation due to war and drought. This year's letter asks for continued strong support of the nutrition programs. We seek expansion of a program that provides additional SNAP benefits for fresh fruits and vegetables at farmer's markets, and increased efforts to prevent food waste. (About 1/3 of all food produced in our country is wasted, and the main component of landfills is food!) And international food assistance needs continued strong support in this time of war, drought and famine. Please sign three letters - to both Senators Richard Durbin and Tammy Duckworth, and to your Representative - either Nikki Budzinski or Mary Miller. If you are not sure, we have a laptop and will quickly identify your Rep at www.house.gov. Please read the letter prayerfully, and consider adding a handwritten note at the bottom or on the back, especially if you have personal experience or knowledge of food insecurity. Also, please join Bread for the World yourself and support it financially. And we would joyfully welcome you to the local chapter that meets every third Tuesday at 1:30 pm by Zoom. 
